
happy, safe and joyous Holiday Season filled with simple pleasures. Thank you for the many ways you support our teachers, our children and our families.

Our Grey Stone Parent Committee Rocks!



Kindergarten

 The kindergarten class has been at work and play,
 fast and furiously this fall! The kindergarteners learned about
 and compared the lifestyles of the Plains Indians and the
 Northeast Woodland Indians. Students also designed their
 own shields and clay medallions. Of course, the highlight
 of our Native American study was our class celebration of

 We were also busy with our studies of penguins

In January, we will start the new year with our weather unit. Students will track the weather and give a weather report daily. We will do several science experiments and we will even make it rain in our classroom! Our favorite weatherman, Bill Reh (aka Mrs. Reh's husband), will pay a visit and teach us more about the weather and what it is like to be a meteorologist. After our weather unit, we will have our study of the US Postal System. We will set up a post office in our room and go on a field trip to the post office. Other units in winter include learning about bears and nutrition, including the famous kindergarten breakfast prepared by the students! Never a dull moment in
